## **Egg Farmers of Ontario:**

- Is a marketing board established by the Government of Ontario;
- \* Responds to crisis in the egg/pullet industry;
- Is a producer organization;
- Mandatory membership;
- Producer elected representation as Egg and Pullet Councillors;
- Councillors are elected as Board members;
- Board members elect EFO's Officers, Committees, & Representatives.

#### **EFO Board of Directors:**

- Hold regular monthly meetings;
- Hold special meetings when required;
- ❖ Develop regulations, policies and programs within EFO's legal framework;
- Quota: allocation, administration, allotment, transfers and policy development;
- Monitor regulatory policy and program compliance and effectiveness;
- Receive and consider Board committee and staff reports;
- Deal with egg and pullet farmers/industry/government concerns or issues;
- Egg Farmers of Canada's provincial allocations / reports / issues / responses;
- Conduct egg and pullet farmer appearances, reconsiderations/appeals;
- Review Board finances, income and expenses, develop and monitor adherence to EFO's annual budget;
- Through EFO's Chair or other designated spokesperson, represents egg and pullet growers.

# **EFO Quota Allocations**

- Quotas are the basis of the supply management system for eggs & pullets;
- ❖ Adherence to quota allocations is the primary egg and pullet farmer responsibility;
- Quota allocations are determined by EFO's Board, based on many factors, including but not limited to:
  - 1. Meeting egg and pullet market requirements at all times;
  - 2. Egg grader and breaker requirements;
  - 3. Cost of production considerations;
  - 4. Maximizing egg and pullet farmer efficiencies;
  - 5. Housing density;
  - 6. New entrants;
  - 7. Concerns/directives from the Ontario Farm Products Marketing Commission;
  - 8. Egg Farmers of Canada allocations and decisions
    - a. Rulings by the Farm Products Council of Canada
  - 9. Import replacement
- EFO has the authority to fix and allot quotas on whatever basis it considers proper.

# **EFO Quota & Transfers**

- Quota is the property of EFO;
- Quota is allotted by EFO to individual egg/pullet farmers for their use;
- ❖ EFO allows quota transfers under certain conditions in its discretion;
- Quota is allotted to a producer in respect of that producer's registered premises;
- ❖ Quota is not subject to 3<sup>rd</sup> party liens/encumbrances;
- ❖ EFO recognizes 3<sup>rd</sup> party liens/encumbrances on registered premises under certain conditions;
- ❖ EFO may not allow a quota transfer where a party is in breach of any EFO requirements [not in Good Standing];
- EFO allows within family transfers upon application;
- All transfers must proceed through EFO's

# **EFO Enforcement**

EFO's Regulations, Policies and Procedures have the force of law; compliance is mandatory

EFO inspection/enforcement procedures;

EFO sanctions for non-compliance:

- Over quota levy;
- 2. Quota reduction/cancellation;
- 3. Reduction/denial of additional quota allotment;
- Denial or restrictions on quota transfers or participation in EFO programs;
- 5. Interest on overdue licence fees/levies;
- 6. Licence suspension/cancellation;
- 7. Prosecution in Provincial Court, Criminal Division and fines;
- 8. Legal action for injunction;
- 9. Legal action for collection of outstanding licence fees/levies.

#### **Egg & Pullet Farmer Compliance**

- ❖ Be familiar with and adhere to EFO's regulations, policies, programs and procedures;
- Stay within a producer's quota allotment;
- Allow EFO inspections and counts;
- If a non-quota producer, stay within the limits of the exemption and be in compliance with all terms and conditions;
- Adhere to egg quality policy;
- Market all eggs through regulated egg grading stations or report otherwise;
- Keep proper books and records to prove compliance if necessary.
