

## **Zone Structure by Counties, Townships & Municipalities**

### 1. Ontario Farmers are divided into ten zones, as follows:

- [1] Zone ONE, comprising the Counties of Essex, Kent, Lambton.
- [2] Zone TWO, comprising the County of Middlesex.
- [3] Zone THREE, comprising the Counties of Elgin, Oxford, and that part of the Regional Municipality of Haldimand Norfolk that, on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of March 1974 was the County of Norfolk.
- [4] Zone FOUR, comprising the County of Brant, the Regional Municipalities of Hamilton-Wentworth and Niagara and that part of the Regional Municipality of Haldimand-Norfolk that, on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of March 1974, was the County of Haldimand.
- [5] Zone FIVE, comprising the County of Huron.
- [6] Zone SIX , comprising the County of Perth, the Townships of Wellesley & Wilmot in the Regional Municipality of Waterloo and the Townships of North Dumfries and Woolwich and the City of Waterloo in the Regional Municipality of Waterloo.
- [7] Zone SEVEN, comprising the County of Wellington and the Counties of Bruce, Dufferin, and Grey.
- [8] Zone EIGHT, comprising the Regional Municipalities of Halton and Peel, the Counties of Hastings, Northumberland, Peterborough, Prince Edward, Simcoe and Victoria, the Provisional County of Haliburton, and the Regional Municipalities of Durham and York, and, the District Municipality of Muskoka.
- [9] Zone NINE EAST, comprising the Counties of Dundas, Frontenac, Grenville, Lanark, Leeds, Lennox and Addington, Renfrew, the Regional Municipality of Ottawa and Carleton, and  
  
Zone NINE NORTH, comprising the Territorial Districts of Ontario consisting of Algoma, Cochrane, Parry Sound, Kenora and Rainy River, Sudbury and Timiskaming, Thunder Bay.
- [10] Zone TEN, comprising the Counties of Glengarry, Prescott, Russell, Stormont.
