

## **Home Week Policy**

amended August 2022

- 1. To achieve stability, reliability and predictability in the supply of eggs, EFO requires layer producers to place their flocks during a Home Week (HW).
- 2. A HW is the pre-determined and pre-approved week during which layer producers are required to place their flock in the egg production facility in respect of which EFO has fixed and allotted quota.
- 3. A HW is in place annually and may only be changed upon application to EFO.
- 4. To provide flexibility, EFO permits layer producers to place their flocks during the week immediately preceding and immediately succeeding the HW (the Exemption Weeks).
- 5. Layer flocks must remain in egg production for fifty-one (51) weeks from the placement date.
- 6. Layer producers are required to have a mandatory minimum downtime (MMD) of seven (7) days between layer flocks.
- 7. Layer producers may apply to EFO to extend their flock's laying period for the current production year.
- 8. Upon EFO approval, the layer producer is required to pay EFO a calculated amount per leviable dozen eggs to account for the pullet cost that is not incurred for production beyond fifty-two (52) weeks. This amount, which is posted on the <a href="https://www.getcracking.ca">www.getcracking.ca</a> website, is reviewed by EFO on a regular basis and may be changed accordingly.
- 9. Layer producers seeking changes to a HW must complete and file with EFOnline an "Application for Change in Home Week" prior to EFO issuing the associated Allotment.
- 10. Layer producers that place flocks outside the Exemption Weeks are subject to an over-quota levy of ten (10) cents per bird per day, calculated on the number of birds at placement multiplied by the number of days outside the Exemption Weeks.
- 11. A layer producer contravening the MMD and placing a flock outside of the Exemption Weeks is subject to an over-quota levy of ten (10) cents per bird per day for every day that deviates from the MMD.
